Equality Statement

At Sir Thomas Fremantle School we welcome our duties under the Equality Act 2010. The school's general duties, with regards to equality are:

We will regularly review the progress we are making to meet our equality objectives.

<u>Objective 1</u>: To have zero incidents of racist, sexist, homophobic, religious intolerance or prejudiced behaviour or language through the implementation of an open culture of understanding, acceptance and positivity.

<u>Action</u>: A comprehensive PSCHEE programme that reflects and celebrates the diverse nature of British society.

<u>Objective 2</u>: To rigorously monitor the achievement of all students and analyse their performance in groups, including recognising those with protected characteristics and ensure measures are implemented to close any gaps so all students achieve and succeed.

<u>Action</u>: Regularly monitor the progress and achievement of all students focussing on groups such as girls, boys, SEN, disadvantaged, Pupil Premium and high attainment at Key Stage 2 and comparing these results to in school and national figures. Use the monitoring to inform intervention to ensure all students make progress.

<u>Objective 3</u>: To monitor and support students with SEND needs through our SEND department. <u>Action</u>: Provide in class support, education/emotional/social interventions and exam access arrangements support to students who have SEND needs.
