


We are also looking for cracker donations to help make the canteen feel special! If you have any to donate, they can be dropped off at the school office.

The school office day starts around 6:30am when we receive the calls from staff, we then contact agencies for supply and look at our own schedules to adapt and cover classes. 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We did receive a 'Yellow Weather Warning' today from the local authority stating:

We currently have a yellow cold weather health alert issued for the SE of England (this warning covers the whole of Buckinghamshire), which will continue until midday on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> Dec. Significant impacts are possible across the health and social care sector due to forecast weather conditions, including:

- observed increase in illness across the population, particularly in the 65+ age group or those with certain underlying health conditions, but impacts may also be seen in younger age groups;
- increased demand for remote health care services likely;
- possible impact on the workforce which may affect the ability of services to be delivered;
- maintaining indoor temperatures at recommended 18°c may become challenging for some, leading to increased risk of vulnerable people.

The forecast is cold to very cold weather persisting, with widespread overnight frost and freezing fog patches. Staying cold into the coming week, but likely turning less cold from Tuesday.
